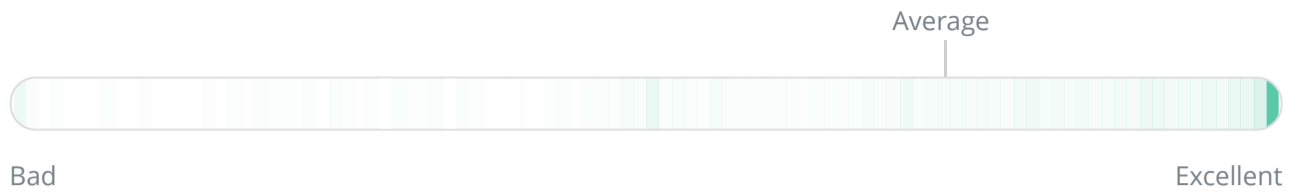

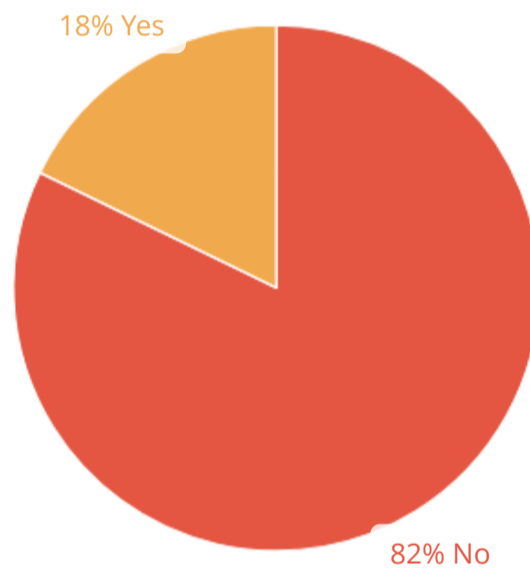

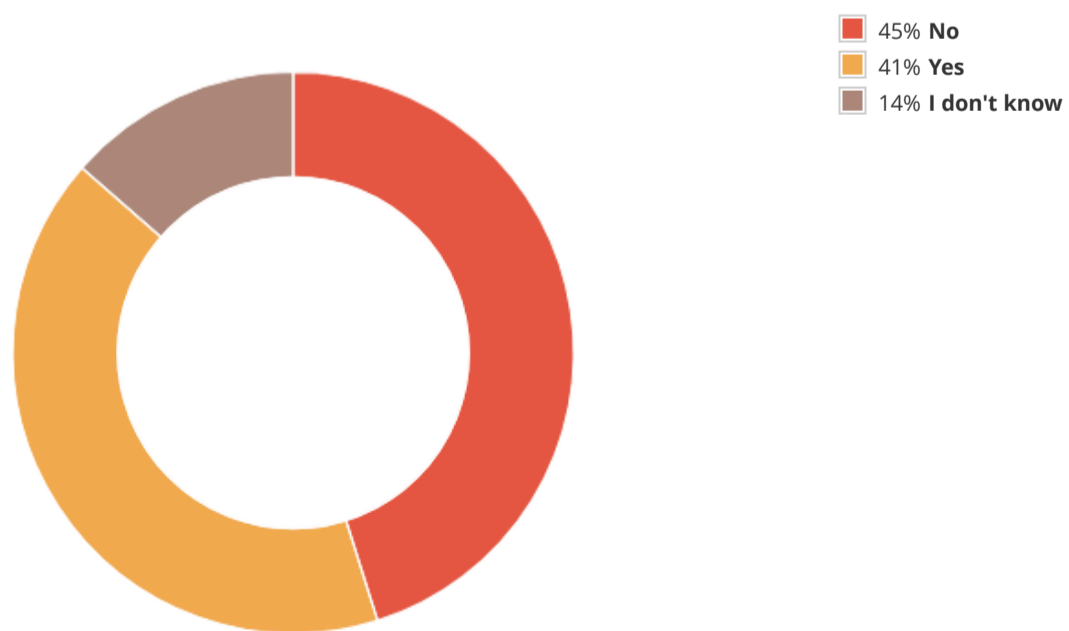

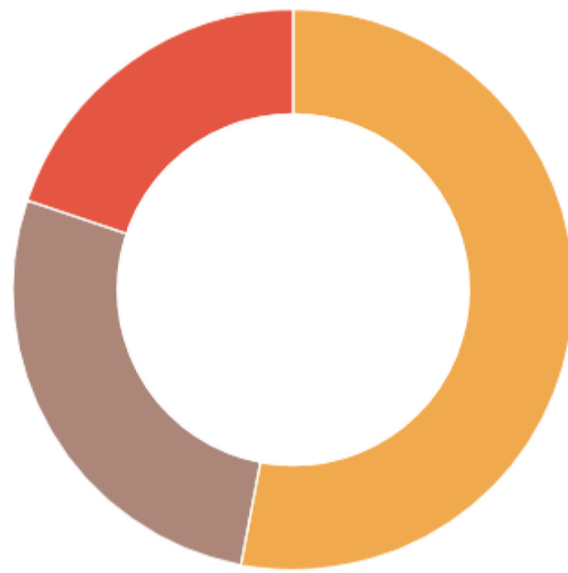

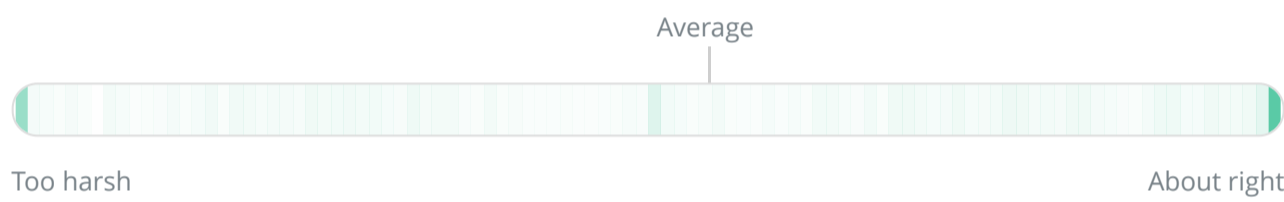

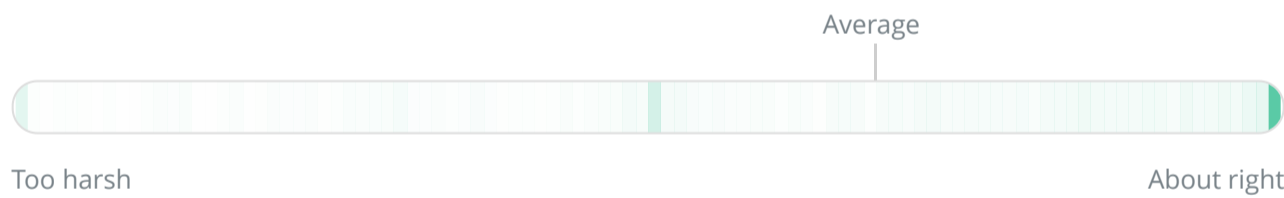
* In general, how would you describe the tactics used by law enforcement throughout the nation? Use your mouse or finger to adjust the slider below.

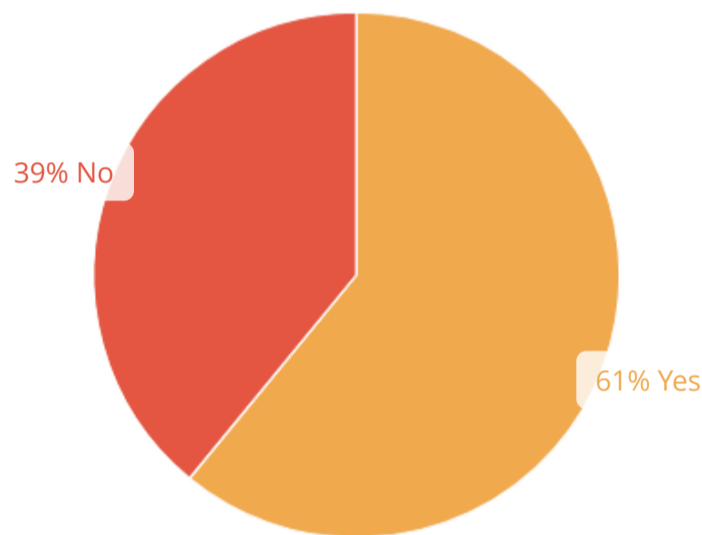

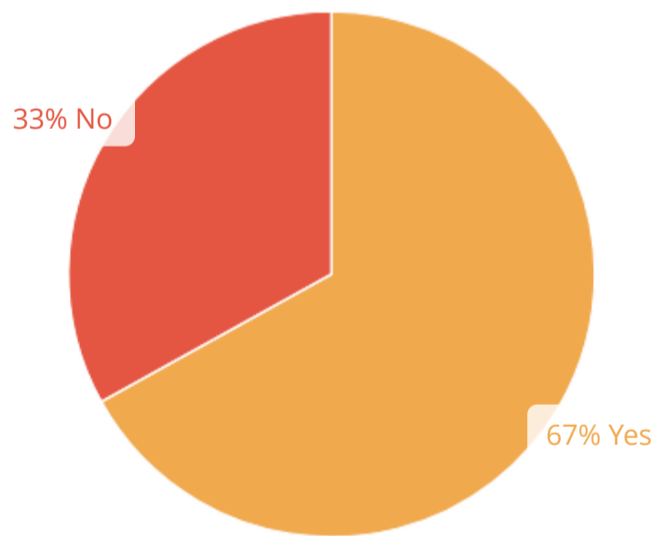

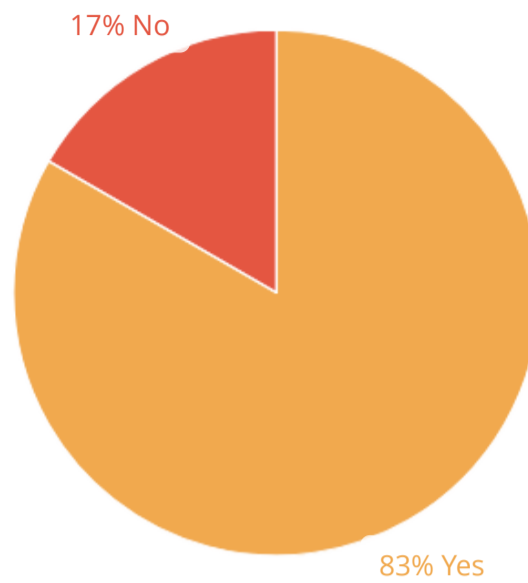

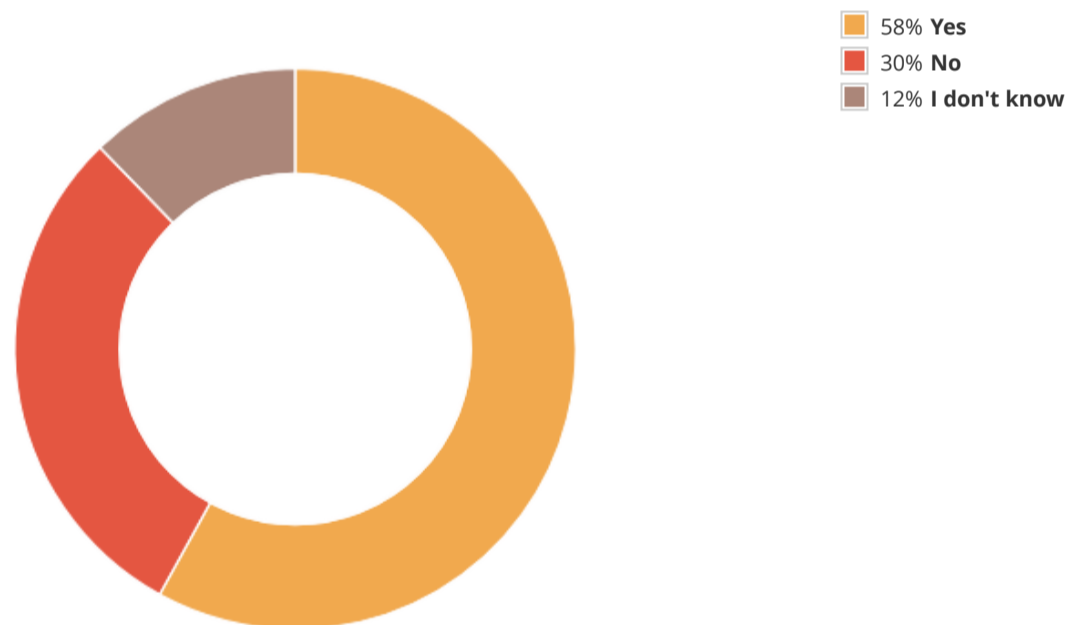

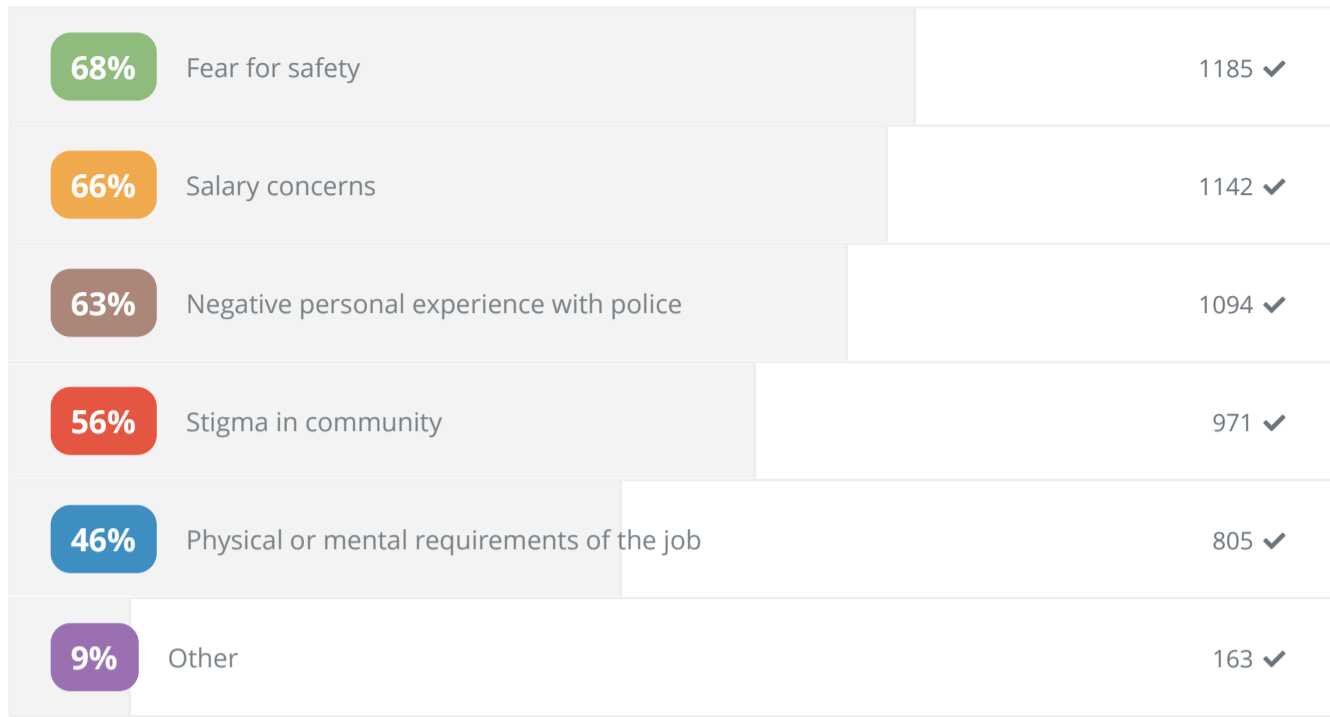

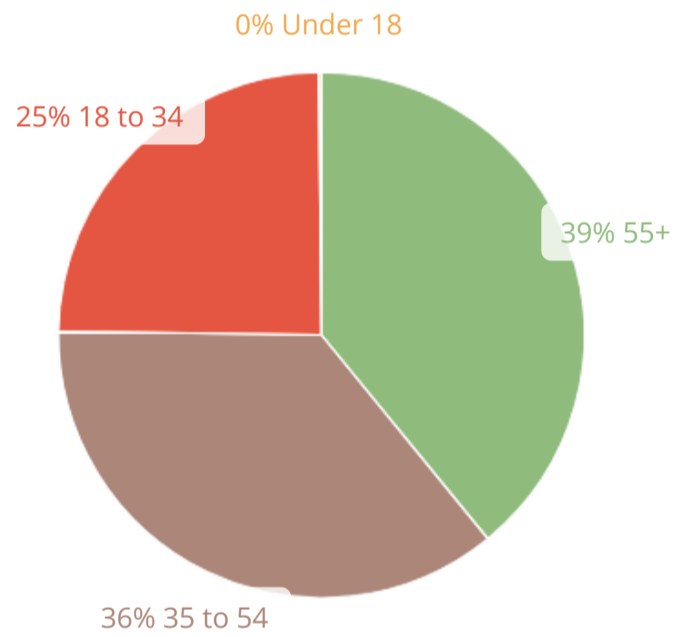

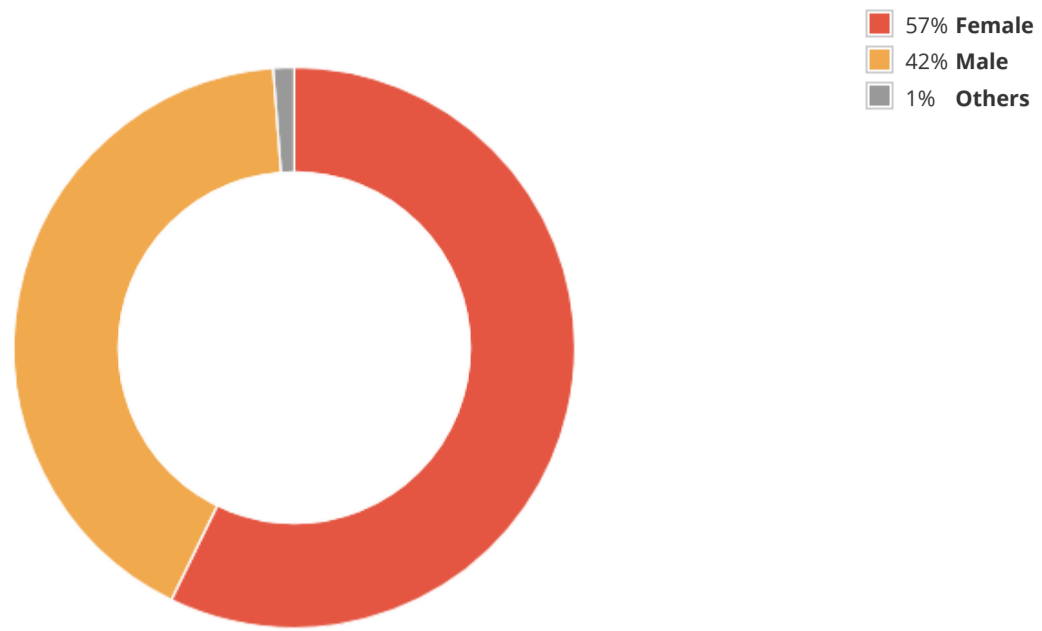

* What is your gender?

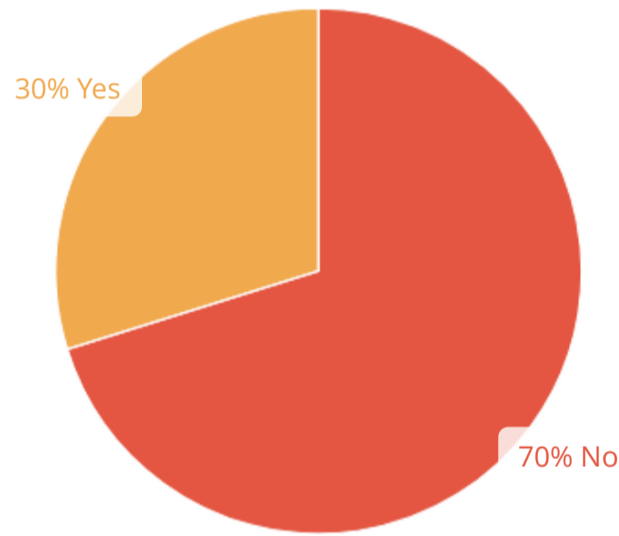

* Are there school-age children in your household?

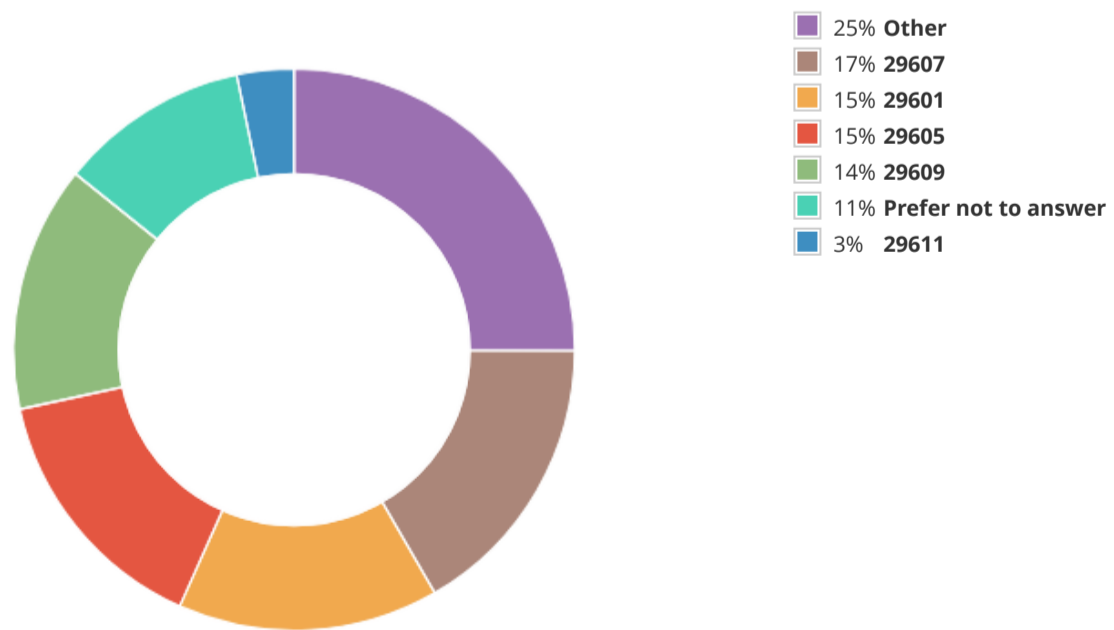
